In 2021, the 87th Texas Legislature passed Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 23 creating the Texas America250 Commission. The Commission is tasked with helping celebrate and commemorate the 250th anniversary of the signing of the U.S. Declaration of Independence. Led by six designated commissioners and an advisory panel of history-minded organizations from around the state, the Texas America250 Commission's mission aspires to promote a deeper understanding of the founding of the United States and the contributions of Texans as we strive towards a more perfect union for future generations.

The Texas America 250 Commission goals to carry out this mission are to:

- ★ Enhance civic knowledge of the founding principles of the country and the rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.
- ★ Encourage Texans to unite in commemorating the Semiquincentennial.
- ★ Promote scholarship and research that illuminates the history of the American West and Texas' role in the formation of the nation.
- ★ Recognize the service and sacrifices of veterans and their families, who have protected our liberties and independence for future generations.
- ★ Collect, track, and share information about Texas events and activities planned for the 250th, and assess and report to the state on their impact.

Order of the Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez

The Order of the Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez was established to educate the public on Spain's critical contributions to the American Revolutionary War. Led by General Bernardo de Gálvez, who served as governor of Louisiana, Spain played a pivotal role in supporting the colonies and their fight for independence. Founded during the Bicentennial in 1976, the Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez is dedicated to sharing this important contribution and will once again join the celebrations in 2026.

One of their exciting commemoration initiatives is an educational coloring book titled *American Independence: The Spanish Secret.* This book will highlight Spain's part in the revolution in a fun and engaging format.

The Texas America 250 Advisory Panel includes several members from various Granaderos chapters across the state.



Texas Public Broadcasting Association (Texas PBS)

Kierstan Schwab, Executive Director of Texas Public Broadcasting Association (Texas PBS), represents Texas PBS on the Texas America250 Commission Advisory Panel. PBS plays a vital role in serving the community, offering a variety of programming through local partnerships, statewide reach, and national affiliations. With 10 PBS stations throughout the State, Texas PBS connects viewers to meaningful content across multiple platforms. For the 250th, PBS will premiere *The American Revolution*, a film by Ken Burns. Additionally, there will be a national focus on civics education with PBS Kids programs such as *Rosie's Rules*, *City Island*, and *Together We Can!*

The Advisory Panel consists of participants representing historically minded and community-centric organizations from across Texas who have committed to collaborating and amplifying 250th efforts on the local, state, and national levels.

Texas Members of The Congressional America 250 Caucus
